As stated in its Charter, the United Nations was established for the purpose of maintaining international peace and security. However, global challenges such as conflicts among nations, conflicts within regions, climate change, pandemics, and accelerating technological innovation are becoming threats to humanity. The United Nations member states must work together to address these global challenges. To this end, we wish to promote international cooperation with respect for human rights and freedoms for all, regardless of nationality, race, gender, language, culture, or religion, in solving international political, economic, social, and humanitarian problems.

The United Nations is addressing global issues such as international peace, environmental problems, COVID-19, and other threats. In order to maintain international peace and security as enshrined in the UN Charter, member states and we should act in accordance with the principles of justice and international law. It is also important to achieve international cooperation and respect for all people's human rights and freedoms, without discrimination based on race, gender, language, or religion, in solving international economic, social, cultural, and humanitarian problems.

Therefore, on September 21, the International Day of Peace, adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 1981, the Committee holds a ceremony every year to commemorate the International Day of Peace by ringing bells and other instruments across Japan to pray for world peace and solidarity, transcending the boundaries of various fields and factions.

To carry out the purpose and philosophy of the United Nations, we are making the following arrangements.

- 1. The representatives of various institutions have been requested to participate in this ceremony and play their respective roles.
- Temples and other institutions with bells and other musical instruments have been requested to ring them at their respective locations to pray for world peace and to record a video of the event, which will be edited and made public later on.
- 3. If you are able to come to Tokyo, we would like you to participate not only in the ceremony but also in the symposium to be held at Sophia University after the Peace Bell Ceremony.
